This course reviews, strengthens and deepens students' understanding of the main grammatical structures. It consolidates the rules introduced previously in Basics of English Grammar and Intensive English. It focuses on how to use and practice English tenses effectively. It concentrates on the form and use of different types of clauses and passive constructions and the way sentences are joined using different conjunctions. It also gives students practice in the use of gerunds and infinitives. In addition, it focuses on the use of the different types of conditional sentences.

- 7- Practice using the targeted grammatical structures individually, in pair/group work, and classroom discussion.
- 8- Correct themselves when using the targeted grammatical structures.
